



## Terms and Abbreviations

Abbreviations are needed to avoid repeating long words and instructions. It is easy to work fast if you learn the terms as you follow each step.

### Common terms and abbreviations

<b>st , sts. . .</b> stitch, stitches	<b>ch . . . .</b> chain
<b>sc . . . . .</b> single crochet	<b>sl st . . .</b> slip stitch
<b>dc . . . . .</b> double crochet	<b>h dc . . .</b> half double crochet
<b>tog . . . . .</b> together	<b>inc . . . .</b> increase
<b>rep . . . . .</b> repeat	<b>dec . . . .</b> decrease
<b>YO. . . . .</b> Yarn Over needle	<b>work even -</b> without changes
*—* between Asterisks -.repeat same pattern	

### New Crochenit™ terms and abbreviations

<b>LC . . . . .</b> Light Color	<b>DC . . . .</b> Dark Color
<b>PU . . . . .</b> Pick Up stitches	<b>CHO . .</b> CHain Off between sts
<b>BS . . . . .</b> Basic Stitch	<b>Hst . . . .</b> High stitch
<b>K st . . . .</b> Knit stitch (The knit look with the crochet hook)	
<b>TH . . . . .</b> Turn Hook around to use the other end
